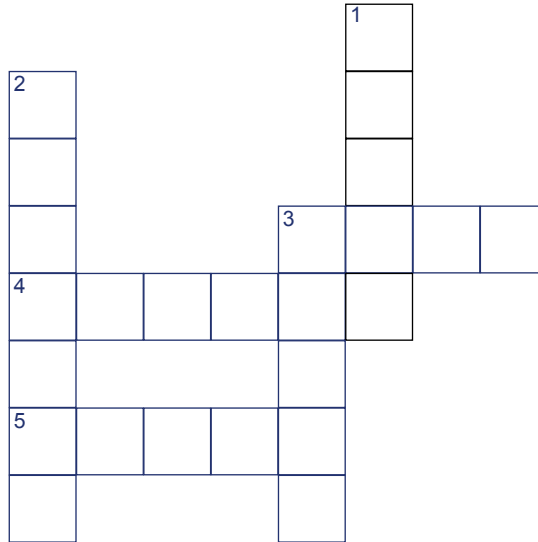
This first chapter in the Bible is very important because:

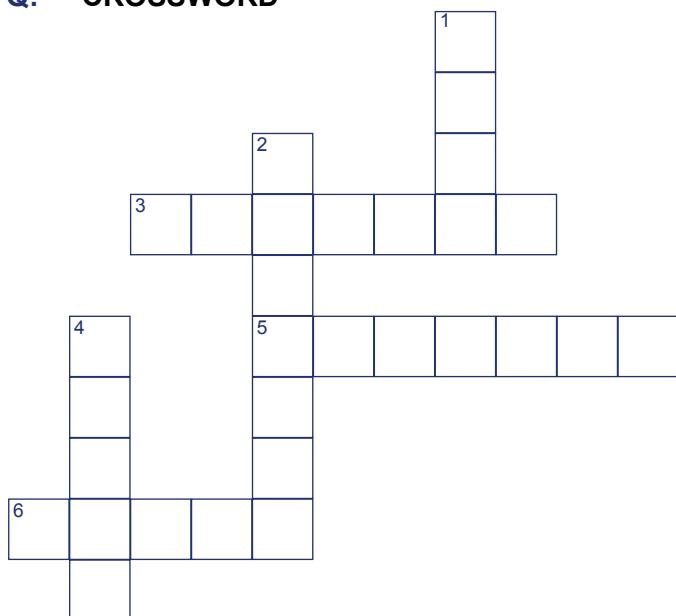

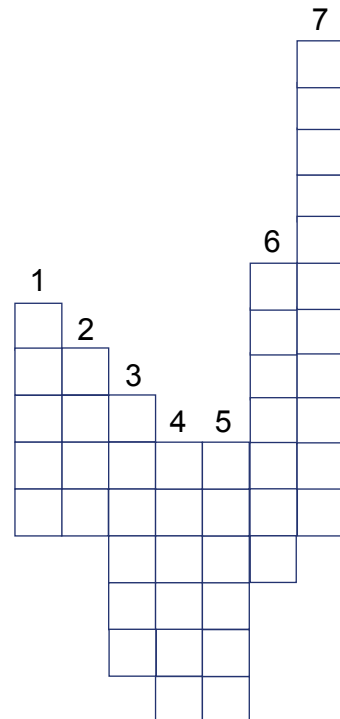

Sin will always be punished, and the first sin of Adam and Eve was not an exception.

“Then the eyes of both of them were opened.” (verse 7) This does not mean that they had been going round with their eyes shut! God explains in verse 22 how they can now “see” something which they could not see before.
